NS Grant Equips Green Springs Firefighters

Ohio regulations require that firefighting personal protective equipment be replaced every ten years, regardless of the condition. The regulation ensures that firefighters walk into emergencies with the optimal chance of coming out safe. Thanks to a \$15,000 grant from Norfolk Southern, the Green Springs Fire Department's equipment is now up to industry standards.

The Green Springs Volunteer Fire Department was a 2024 recipient of a \$15,000 Norfolk Southern Safety-First Grant. The grants were created to promote community safety across Norfolk Southern's 22-state network and are distributed to nonprofit organizations, schools and government entities that provide direct safety service or operate programs that support safe behavior.

To be eligible, the fund requests must align with at least one of Norfolk Southern's focus areas of safety,
